A Word From the Pastor

Cast Your Net

When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught."

John 21:9-10 (NRSV)

He is risen! Christ is risen indeed! He has opened the gates and offered us new life, a new way of being, and a path through life full of abundance. Jesus calls us to a different way of being, a way that has been transformed through love, grace, and forgiveness that looks different from the ways that the world (and perhaps even some of our religious communities) operate. Throughout our lives, we have many similar moments like when the disciples encountered Jesus on the lake shore, moments where all of a sudden hope and grace break through the monotony or the despair and we are given a choice on whether...

.... to follow Christ or not.

We find these same themes in John 21:1-14. After Jesus had appeared to the disciples, I'm sure that moment of awe and wonder lasted about as long as a sunrise. No doubt, the disciples probably quickly grew to wonder what this all meant while "normal life" set in. In, perhaps, a disheartened moment, Peter, Thomas, James, John, and two others go fishing. They fall back on something familiar, comfortable, and known, but not what they're called to. The results are predictable, a long night of very little fish and much frustration; but come morning, they see someone having breakfast on the lake shore. At once the man asks if they had caught any fish. I can just see the downcast eyes and heads shaken in annoyance. I can almost hear a defiant and frustrated, "no" come from the group. So of course the man tells them to cast their nets on the other side of the boat. Sure enough, the catch is enough fish to almost break the net, a surprise, a miracle, and something that triggers a memory deep within one of the disciples. "Peter," they must have cried, "it is the Lord!"

Amazing, it seems, how quickly we return to our old habits and patterns. As has been said many times over, if we do the same thing we can expect the same results, and here we have the disciples and Christ retelling that same story, proclaiming that same wisdom. Perhaps, what we need now in our own lives is cast the net on the other side. What we just might need now is to truly remember the words of Christ and follow them, rather than just fall back into the old wheel ruts and cattle paths that we so easily and comfortably end up on. The alternative is to keep coming up with empty nets, to keep fishing and finding that our efforts have been less than effective and less than encouraging.

On the other hand, what if we did cast our net to the other side? What if we did try to pursue life where we had pursued security? What if we did let go of the "form" of how it's always been done so that we can find the "essence"? What would happen if we imagined a world that could be instead of complaining about the world that is? What might we find if we commit to conversations over accusations? Forgiveness over grudges? Cooperation over control? Not only in our own personal lives, but what if the Church was willing to cast it's net on the other side? To hold to the teachings of Jesus rather than the old habits of our communities? What would it look like for the Church to listen to the old, loving encouragement from Christ and try something new? Of course, we be surprised with how effective it could be. We might be strained to bursting from the success we find. And, without a doubt, it won't come without effort. But the outcome is sure, the blessings are guaranteed: reunion with the ones we love, strengthened relationships that care for us, enough food and resources for everyone, and a reinstatement and a re-elevation to what we have been called to do and who we were meant to be. If we were to cast our nets on the other side, if we were to truly commit to something new, I am convinced that we will find hope, and life, and joy.

This is my prayer for us this Easter season as we journey towards Pentecost: may we remember the teachings of Christ, the essence of what he taught and encouraged us in, and may we let go of the old habits and ways of living that do not align with the love of Jesus and the grace of God. May we cast our nets on the other side and strive to find the ways and the places that the Spirit is already active in the world. And may God instill within us a spirit of trust for one another, of courage to step out in faith, and one of love between us that will proclaim to the world the Christ is risen, death will not win, and a better world is possible in both the here-and-now as well as the here-after. Cast your net on the other side, and see what God will do. Amen.


Additionally, thank you to Scott Johnston, Brent Meyer, and Jim Stephenson for installing the new TVs in the Fellowship Hall.


