A Word From the Pastor

Christ Before Us

"For it is the gentiles who seek these things, and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." Matthew 6:32-33 (NRSV)

As another Lenten season is well underway, I'd like to offer a chance for us to take some time and reflect upon the focus of our lives. Typically, this season in the church is where we remove something from our lives that distracts us from the grace of God, tempts us to stumble in our faith, or binds us to sin and harm. Traditional "vices" include: caffeine, chocolate, too much TV (or social media),

...foul language, or old grudges. Another newer tradition recognizes both the power in letting go of a vice while also adding a virtue to our lives. Any number of added habits or practices that I've heard of range from: volunteering once a week, adding a short time for daily prayer, saying thank you more, spending time with family, reading your bible, etc.

And while these are good practices to engage in (I've certainly committed to adding a virtue and subtracting a vice myself), I've noticed that sometimes even in the pursuit of health and wholeness we lose sight of the bigger picture. It's an old prayer from St. Patrick that starts with the opening line, "Christ be with us, Christ before us, Christ behind us..." Reflecting then on this line, as well as what the author of the Gospel of Matthew offers to us, I wonder if sometimes we focus on the symptoms rather than the cause, the outward identifiers rather than the essence, and in doing so miss out on the good things that God has in store for us. What would life be like if we kept Christ before us in all that we do? I've found that when we're honest with ourselves, most problems or challenges are spiritual in nature, rather than technical or material, and to keep our focus on Christ allows us to overcome any obstacle and enter fully into God's blessing, grace, and love.

So this Lenten season I invite us, as we commit to engaging in better, healthier practices, to keep an image of Christ before us. That in doing so, choosing health and loving our bodies can be a reflection of Christ's love for us, or giving up old grudges or hurtful language can be an enactment of our freedom in Christ, or engaging in deeper prayer and study can be sustained by the one who made us, loves us, and gives us the ability to be fully who we are. May we all seek first the kingdom of God and the love of Christ, and may the inherent blessing that that love already is, overflow into countless other unforeseen blessings as well.

May it be so. Amen.


