A Word From the Pastor

An Easter People

March 31st came and went this year with celebrations, songs of hope, and prayers that the resurrection of Christ might take root in our hearts as we long for his return. It was a joyful Easter, filled with family, friends and a sigh of relief that only going through Lent can bring. And then, came April with it's warmer weather and spring cleaning, and now May is upon us as the school year ends and we prepare for summer. Easter, it seems, is relegated to one day, perhaps a weekend at most, and then it's over and we look ahead to the turning of the seasons.

But in the church calendar, as we journey towards the Church's birthday on Pentecost, our tradition holds that Easter is not merely a day, but rather a months long season. That Christ's resurrection is cause for celebration that lasts for several weeks! This might surprise some of us, and if we're honest with ourselves a celebration that lasts more than a weekend might seem a little excessive to our Iowan sensibilities.

Yet, nevertheless, the Church has intuited something important about this event that we remember every year. Perhaps we would do well to ask the question, "what would it look like to truly celebrate for an entire 50 days, a mini-jubilee?"

Even more to the point, perhaps the further and deeper call that Christ is inviting us into, is to become an Easter People. What would it look like if we lived out what one of our aspirational hymns, Easter People, Raise Your Voices, cries out,

"Easter people, raise your voices, sounds of heaven in earth should ring. Christ has brought us heaven's choices; heavenly music, let it ring."

The hardest thing about this prayer, I've found, is truly believing that a new world is not only possible but breaking forth into the world today. As Christ reminds us when the religious leaders of his day asked him about the Kingdom of God,

"The Kingdom of God is not coming with things that can be observed, nor will they say, 'Look, here it is!' or 'There it is!' for, in fact, the Kingdom of God is among you."

Luke 17:20-21 (NRSVue)

Jesus spent the majority of his ministry healing the sick, eating with the people, and proclaiming that the Kingdom of God was near. What then would it take to believe so deeply in the Gospel that Easter becomes not just a day or a weekend once a year, or even a season of fifty days that we merely give a nod to; what would it look like if Easter became a reality that we lived in every day of our lives because the Spirit resides so deeply in our hearts that it can do nothing short of flow through us and from us for the blessing of the world? The continuation of that hymn goes on to pray:

"Every day to us is Easter, with its resurrection song.

When in trouble move the faster to our God who rights the wrong."

What do we need to live in hope, to trust so fully our God that love is the order of the day, relationships are reconciled, and Christ's sheep (both of his flock and those not yet called) are clothed, fed, and sheltered? What would it look like for the Reign of God to be realized in our present time and place?

The first step, for all of us, is to begin to be enraptured by the possibility of the Holy Spirit. Pray that the vision that the Prophet Joel had comes to fruition, that God's Spirit would be poured out on all peoples, that our sons and daughter would deliver the Word of God, that our old would dream about what could be, that our children would have visions of the world to come (Joel 2:28). Pray for that future, and pray for it daily, because it is a future where all the children of God, all the siblings of faith, and the whole Body of Christ will be working hand in hand together. Then, once we are all in conversation with God and with one another, perhaps every day can be realized as an Easter day and we can live in the resurrection song.

May it be so. Amen.


